Focus on ... *The 10 Commandments*



We have begun a new sermon series on the 10 commandments. Over the next 10 weeks we will be working through each commandment in turn, exploring how they point us to God's good plans for our lives and his saving work in Jesus. Last week Peter kicked us off with a reflection on how the 10 Commandments are still relevant today.

At Hope Church in the afternoon, Matt asked the room if anyone had ever lied. All hands went up! When we examine ourselves by the standard set by the 10 commandments (especially when we remember that Jesus tells us that the state of our heart matters as much as our outward actions) we all quickly see how we have failed to keep them. But God knows our failings and still loves us. That's why he sent Jesus to die for us, so that we in our sinful state, exposed as unrighteous in the light of the commandments, can be forgiven and restored to right relationship with our heavenly Father. Even in these ancient laws we can see the grace of God and the good news of Jesus revealed!
