Focus on ... *The Trinity Community Café*

Around about September last year, we announced the fact that the Community Café that was run in conjunction with the Well Church, would become a Trinity Parish project and the name would change from The Well Café to The Trinity Café.



It continues to run on a Thursday morning 10:00 to 12:00 and Sundays 15:00 to 17:00 and has an open-door policy to whoever wants to attend.

Thursdays, we provide a light breakfast and the time to listen to people's problems, access to the internet for job searches, benefit enquiries or accommodation searches.

Just last month, Catherine helped a gentleman who has no access to the internet to claim his state pension for the first time. We are able to help people to respond to official letters that some of our community don't necessarily understand or would normally ignore.

Sunday remains our signature soup and a sandwich, with a choice of cakes and a portion of God's word, which along with the good food is accepted gratefully generating some interesting questions and conversations.

But, like every good community project, The Trinity Café costs money to run. Despite the generous support from The Blackpool Food Bank there are still items we need to purchase to make this project work, and of course there is always a need to grow and expand what we do, especially in these difficult times.

To that end, we appeal to your generous nature.
